

## Boundary Commission for Scotland First Periodic Review of Scottish Parliament boundaries – Argyll and Bute Council area

The Boundary Commission for Scotland has reviewed its Revised Recommendations for Scottish Parliament constituencies in the light of representations received.

The Commission is proposing to rename Argyllshire and Bute constituency, proposed under its Revised Recommendations, as Argyll and Bute constituency. No other changes are proposed to the revised recommendations. The Commission's Further Recommendations are:
