

## Boundary Commission for Scotland Review of Scottish Parliament boundaries – Fife Council area

The Boundary Commission for Scotland has reviewed its provisional proposals for Scottish Parliament constituencies in the light of all representations received and Local Inquiries held. The Commission has decided to make minor amendments from its provisional proposals to the boundaries of the constituencies in Fife Council area, and to one of the constituency names. The Commission's revised recommendations are:

Constituency	Designation	Electorate	Description
Cowdenbeath	County Constituency	53,670	Fife Council electoral wards 5, 6, 7 (part), 8, 9
Dunfermline	County Constituency	54,230	Fife Council electoral wards 1, 2, 3, 4, 7 (part)
Kirkcaldy	County Constituency	59,580	Fife Council electoral wards 10, 11, 12, 13, 23
Mid Fife and Glenrothes	County Constituency	53,750	Fife Council electoral wards 14, 15, 16, 22
North East Fife	County Constituency	59,360	Fife Council electoral wards 17, 18, 19, 20, 21

The Commission also proposes that these constituencies be combined with other constituencies as listed in the table below to form a Scottish Parliament region:

Region	Electorate	Description
Mid Scotland and Fife	490,700	The constituencies of Clackmannanshire and Dunblane; Cowdenbeath; Dunfermline; Kirkcaldy; Mid Fife and Glenrothes; North East Fife; Perthshire North; Perthshire South and Kinross-shire; Stirling.
