

## Boundary Commission for Scotland Review of Scottish Parliament boundaries – Glasgow City Council area

The Boundary Commission for Scotland has reviewed its provisional proposals for Scottish Parliament constituencies in the light of all representations received and Local Inquiries held. The Commission has decided to amend the boundaries of some of the constituencies in Glasgow City Council area from its provisional proposals, and to amend the constituency names. The Commission's revised recommendations are:

Glasgow Cathcart	Burgh Constituency	57,710	Glasgow City Council electoral wards 1, 2, 7
Glasgow Kelvin	Burgh Constituency	58,330	Glasgow City Council electoral wards 10, 11, 12(part), 16(part)
Glasgow Maryhill and Springburn	Burgh Constituency	54,240	Glasgow City Council electoral wards 15, 16 (part), 17
Glasgow Pollok	Burgh Constituency	56,370	Glasgow City Council electoral wards 3, 4, 5 (part)
Glasgow Provan	Burgh Constituency	51,600	Glasgow City Council electoral wards 18, 20 (part), 21
Glasgow Shettleston	Burgh Constituency	52,060	Glasgow City Council electoral wards 9, 19, 20(part)
Glasgow Southside	Burgh Constituency	51,810	Glasgow City Council electoral wards 5 (part), 6, 8

The Commission also proposes that these constituencies be combined with other constituencies as listed in the table below to form a Scottish Parliament region:

Region	Electorate	Description
Glasgow	493,950	The constituencies of Glasgow Anniesland; Glasgow Cathcart; Glasgow Kelvin; Glasgow Maryhill and Springburn; Glasgow Pollok; Glasgow Provan; Glasgow Shettleston; Glasgow Southside; Rutherglen.

The Commission also gives notice that, if Scottish Ministers have made Orders subsequent to the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland's reviews of the boundary between East Dunbartonshire and Glasgow City Council areas at Robroyston and the boundary between Glasgow City and North Lanarkshire Council areas at Cardowan by Stepps, prior to the Commission completing this review of Scottish Parliament boundaries, it intends to amend its constituency and region recommendations so that they continue to be co-terminous with these local authority boundaries where the proposals and recommendations announced in this notice are already so co-terminous.
