

Boundary Commission for Scotland Review of Scottish Parliament boundaries – Perth and Kinross Council area

The Boundary Commission for Scotland has reviewed its provisional proposals for Scottish Parliament constituencies in the light of all representations received and Local Inquiries held. The Commission has decided not to amend the boundaries of the constituencies in Perth and Kinross Council area from its provisional proposals but is recommending amended constituency names. The Commission's revised recommendations are:

Constituency	Designation	Electorate	Description
Perthshire North	County Constituency	52,310	Perth and Kinross Council electoral wards 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 12
Perthshire South and Kinross-shire	County Constituency	55,850	Perth and Kinross Council electoral wards 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11

The Commission also proposes that these constituencies be combined with other constituencies as listed in the table below to form a Scottish Parliament region:

Region	Electorate	Description
Mid Scotland and Fife	490,700	The constituencies of Clackmannanshire and Dunblane; Cowdenbeath; Dunfermline; Kirkcaldy; Mid Fife and Glenrothes; North East Fife; Perthshire North; Perthshire South and Kinross-shire; Stirling.
